

# Wilton's Golden Miles Self-Guided Driving Tour



## WILTON HISTORICAL SOCIETY ~ 224 DANBURY ROAD/ROUTE 7 AT DEERFIELD ROAD (parking entrance on Deerfield)

See 1,000 daffodils blooming in all shades of yellow, white, orange and even pink along the roadside. While you're there, stop inside the **Historical Society** and take a peek at their thoughtfully curated exhibitions and neat collection of antique toys and trains. On your way out, make sure to check out the Museum Gift Shop for quirky, one-of-a-kind gift items.



## NORWALK RIVER VALLEY TRAIL ~ SHARP HILL ROAD AT AUTUMN RIDGE DRIVE (parking lot 1st drive on right on Autumn Ridge)

Park your car and enjoy the daffodils planted on either side of the trail. Take a walk or a run on the trail if you've got the time. The **NRVT** is a beautiful, well-maintained trail through the woods, and a great place to walk your dog.



## AMBLER FARM ~ 257 HURLBUTT STREET AT HYLAND ROAD (parking at Ambler Farm)

**Ambler Farm** sits directly across the road from where Hyland meets Hurlbutt, and from the serenity of its grounds you can view the lovely roadside planting of daffodils at the corner where the two roads meet. Feel free to pull into Ambler's parking area and walk your dog and enjoy the scenic beauty of Wilton's historic farmstead. With rotational crops and farm animals on display, it's a real treat for children and one of the town's few remaining working farms.



## WILTON CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH ~ 70 RIDGEFIELD ROAD AT LOVERS LANE

Pull into the **Congregational Church** parking lot (on the Lovers Lane side of Ridgefield Road) to admire this beautiful, historic church, as well as all the cheerful daffodils planted on either side of Ridgefield Road. And behind the daffodils across the road, you'll see charming **Old Town Hall** — all worth a photo or two!



## HILLSIDE CEMETERY ~ 165 RIDGEFIELD ROAD (parking at Hillside Cemetery)

There, blooming on the slope of the road's "hill" side (the side on which you may notice how the hillside rises upward towards its ridgeline summit) is a large swath of daffodils adding spring beauty to Wilton's own State Scenic Route. The quiet entrance to **Hillside Cemetery** is there on that same side. Feel free to pull into the cemetery and park for a closer look.



## THE WILTON LIBRARY ~ 137 OLD RIDGEFIELD ROAD AT GODFREY PLACE

Here, in Wilton's town center, you can park in the **Wilton Library's** parking lot to get a closer look at the daffodils planted around the base of the flag sculpture next to Old Ridgefield Road by the corner of Godfrey Place. While you're in town, you can browse in the shops or have lunch at one of several restaurants. For a real old-time feel, plunk yourself down at the counter of The Luncheonette and order one of their delicious milkshakes. It's a great way to end a daffy day!
